






## Immunization Schedule for B.C. School Age Children

Vaccine	Grade 6	Grade 9
<b>Chickenpox (Varicella) Vaccine</b> (#44b) <sup>1</sup>		
<b>Hepatitis B Vaccine</b> (#25a) <sup>2</sup>		
<b>Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccines</b> (#101b) <sup>3</sup>		
<b>Meningococcal Quadrivalent Vaccines</b> (#23b)		
<b>Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap) Vaccine</b> (#18c)

<sup>1</sup> The chickenpox vaccine is offered to students in grade 6 who did not receive 2 doses when they were younger. It is not necessary for those who had chickenpox or shingles disease, confirmed by a lab test, at 1 year of age or older to get the vaccine.

<sup>2</sup> Children who were not previously immunized or did not complete their infant hepatitis B vaccine series will be offered hepatitis B vaccine for free in grade 6.

<sup>3</sup> The HPV vaccine is provided free to girls and boys in grade 6 as a series of 2 doses given 6 months apart.
